

# **Nursery Learning Journey Overview for topic; People that help us**

### Why are we learning this now?

In summer we learn about people who help us because the children are beginning to role play and extend their learning with their understanding of the world around themselves. We are introducing this topic using puppets which encourages the children to talk and interact as a group. We have a focus on traditional tales, fairy story's such as Little red riding hood, Rapunzel and Goldilocks, tales which are rich in advice about making choices.

By the end of the Learning Journey, what skills knowledge and experience will the children have?

Knowledge: They will know about doctors, the Police, ambulance drivers, farmers and teachers and how they help us.

Skills: They will know how to discuss why people make certain choices and why.
They will be able to equip their play using correct resources for their chosen occupation.

Experience: they will have experienced role play in these occupations either as themselves or with puppets.

Gross motor skills	Improve their throwing and catching of small balls and use of rackets and nets.
Literacy	Understand what syllables and how to break down some words into sounds.  Gain confidence with rhyme and alliteration, be able to make up their own rhymes for sounds.  Experience hearing and sounding out all the letters sounds in the alphabet.
