Facts

- Christians believe miracles are due to the exercise of God's power and that they reveal something of Him.
- Jesus fed 5000 people with five loaves of bread and two fishes. He prayed over the food and it multiplied so much that it was enough to feed all the 5000 people.
- Christians believe this miracle is a sign of who Jesus is and what he is about.
- It also portrays Jesus as loving and compassionate; deeply interested in the lives of others.
- Jesus shows he is able to do the impossible; indicating that he is no ordinary human being. He is divine – human and yet also the Son of God.
- Christians believe this miracle reminds us about the 'storms' in life and how we can trust God to be the guide through our 'storms' and to bring calmness to our life.
- It encourages Christians to 'call out' to God and pray, just like the disciples called out for help.
