Key Vocabulary

<u>Resist technique</u>- An art technique that uses several layers to expose or define a design in negative space.

<u>Lattice</u>- An openwork framework consisting of a criss-crossed pattern of strips of building material, typically wood or metal.

<u>Mono Printing</u>- a type of printmaking where the intent is to make unique prints that may explore an image serially.

Wrapping - folding over and around

Knotting - tying knots

Binding - fastening together

Threading - sewing through

Things to know

- Tie-dyeing is a method of dyeing by hand in which coloured patterns are produced in the fabric by gathering together many small portions of material and tying them tightly with string before immersing the cloth in the dye bath. ... After drying, the fabric is untied to reveal irregular circles, dots, and stripes.
- Michael Brennand-Wood is an artist working in textiles. He is
 particularly interested in embroidery, lace-making and
 traditions in floral textiles. He uses his knowledge in these
 ancient crafts and combines them with modern day techniques,
 such as digital printing and computerised machine embroidery,
 to create sculptural, wall-hung, textile and multimedia pieces.
