## What is the climate like?



Brazil is the largest country in South America and the fifth largest nation in the world. It forms an enormous triangle on the eastern side of the continent with a coastline along the Atlantic Ocean. It has borders with every South American country except Chile and Ecuador.



Brazil generally has a warmer climate compared to the UK. In many parts of Brazil, temperatures can be quite hot, especially in the summer months.

Brazil is known for its diverse rainfall patterns. The Amazon Rainforest region experiences heavy rainfall throughout the year, while other parts of Brazil may have distinct wet and dry seasons.

**Carnival** plays an important role in both cities. Carnival takes place across Brazil in February, before Lent. The first carnival occurred in Rio in 1723. Around 6 million people attend the carnival in Rio each year.
