

Punctuality

- When we move into Spring term further information will be relayed regarding SATs revision books.




Spellings

- Weekly tests are no required as we graduate towards ensuring accurate spellings in context.

Homework Project

Year 6 Homework Project - Autumn 1

This half term's homework project is based upon our art topic where one of the artists we study is Patrick Heron. Patrick Heron is an abstract artist who is inspired by natural landscapes. He uses mediums such as sketching and painting to create his artwork.



Tasks

- 1) Research the topic of abstract art looking at the different artists.
- 2) Choose one artist, look at their work and pick your favourite piece of art.
- 3) Using the artwork as inspiration create your own piece of art. This can be made using any medium (paint, collage, felt tips, colouring pencils etc) and would ideally be on A3 paper.
- 4) Write a short biography of the artist you have chosen to accompany your piece of artwork. This should include their background, what kind of artist they are, what inspires them and any other interesting facts you find out.


Library - Mondays

- Children will have the opportunity to browse and borrow books from our school library once a week.
- Children will be able to borrow at least 2
 books per visit provided that they return all
 outstanding loaned books.
- Quick reminder, if you have siblings who have just left the school could they please check for any outstanding library books.



Reading

- Children hugely benefit from reading to an adult. Our expectation is that this happens at least once a week at home.
- Children will be provided with colour banded or levelled books to bring home. These bands correlate to our assessment procedure and it is important your child reads these as they are at the correct level. These must stay in bags at all times unless being taken out to be read at home.
- Once completed, children must return these books in exchange for new ones.



Reading Records

- Please ensure your child's reading is brought in daily to be checked by class's teachers.
- Children are expected to record their reading at least 4 times a week but we would encourage every day. Please also encourage your child to write a one sentence summary of what they read in the comments section.

Reading records will be checked: Every Monday.

SATS

- maths, reading, SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) assessed with papers during SATs week
- writing is assessed throughout the year with portfolio of work
- no pressure from the school other than an expectation to do the absolute best.

 2024 Thursday 16th May 2024.



KIRFS



- Key instant recall facts that children should know in each half term in Year 6.
- They have been uploaded to the school website and are in the maths section.
- You should have also received a paper copy from your child.
- First half term is regarding Times Tables and we encourage parents to go through them with their child.



I know the multiplication and division facts for all times tables up to 12×12 .

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts **instantly**.

Please see separate sheet for all times table facts.

This is a chance for Year 6 children to consolidate their knowledge of multiplication and division facts and to increase their speed of recall.

Key Vocabulary

What is 12 multiplied by 6? What is 7 times 8?

What is 84 divided by 7?

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g. $7 \times \bigcirc = 28$ or $\bigcirc \div 6 = 7$.

Children who have already mastered their times tables should apply this knowledge to answer questions including decimals e.g. $0.7 \times \bigcirc = 4.2$ or $\bigcirc \div 60 = 0.7$

Top Tips

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact family of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

<u>Speed Challenge</u> – Take two packs of playing cards and remove the kings. Turn over two cards and ask your child to multiply the numbers together (Ace = 1, Jack = 11, Queen = 12). How many questions can they answer correctly in 2 minutes? Practise regularly and see if they can beat their high score.

<u>Online games</u> – There are many games online which can help children practise their multiplication and division facts. www.conkermaths.org is a good place to start.

<u>Use memory tricks</u> – For those hard-to-remember facts, www.multiplication.com has some strange picture stories to help children remember.

Things parents can do at home

- Use the KIRFs to support maths understanding.
 If your child still does not know their timetables please practice with them. They are crucial to access the learning this year.
- Use knowledge organisers to pre-teach foundation topics so your child already has an understanding at the beginning of a topic.
- Explore the opportunity to take your child on trips at the weekend which relate to the topics we are studying and/or look at books around these topics.
- Make sure your child is reading daily and is completing their weekly homework. It is important to ask them to show them that it is completed as sometimes the children do not do all of it.
 - Engage with their homework projects making sure the children take pride in them.




